## 2025 Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Grant Application(s)

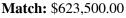

The White Mountain Apache Tribe (WMAT), a federally-recognized Native American tribe residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation (FAIR) in east-central Arizona propose constructing a 15,000-square foot skatepark. A site location has been designated in the heart of Whiteriver, AZ adjacent to Alchesay High School sports fields and multiple neighborhoods, an ideal location to maximize community access. There are plans to build a multi-use park that include walking trails, a basketball court, and a softball field. The first phase of the plan is this project, which will build a skatepark and gathering space with ramadas and an arboretum that includes a rainwater irrigation system. Fruit and native trees will be planted around the skatepark with ramadas for shade and seating. Gutters with rainwater storage tanks will be installed near the ramadas with hose lines connected for efficient tree watering. While there are multiple DIY skateboarding areas across the reservation, the community currently lacks a safe and accessible skatepark.

Quail Drive Sports Park spans 43 acres and features a multipurpose field, three rodeo arenas (including one covered), restroom facilities, a concession stand, a playground, and ample space

for future development, with access from Fort Grant Road, a major roadway in the City of Willcox. In October of 2024, the City of Willcox completed Phase I development of the park, which included converting two ball fields into a multi-use field, fencing the field, upgrading the multi-use field and Rodeo Arena #1 with energy-efficient LED lighting, and constructing a multipurpose covered arena. Unfortunately, rising costs post-COVID-19 pandemic left key elements unfinished. This proposal requests funding to advance the next phase of the original and revised project plan. The project will include installing electrical system, LED lighting, fans, water systems; constructing restrooms, showers, septic system; adding tables, seating/bleachers, arena panels & storage, fencing, arena #1 pen renovations, an equestrian wash rack, a sound system at arena #2, renovating restrooms at Arena #1 and the multi-use field, irrigation and turf removal at the multiuse field. Integrate water-harvesting systems to capture/ divert up to 500,000 gallons of rainwater, supporting native and adaptive landscaping for long-term sustainability.

#### Sponsor: City of Willcox Project: Keiller Park Development Phase II Grant Request: \$689,000.00 Match: \$689,000.00

Total: \$1,378,000.00

Keiller Park spans 18.26 acres and features the City pool and spray park, softball/baseball fields (3), a soccer field, large ramada, asphalt walking trail (0.5 mile), basketball court, playground area, and restrooms. In October of 2024, the City of Willcox completed Phase I development of the park, which included construction of the pool and splash park, upgrading three ballfields with energy-efficient LED lighting, adding drinking fountains, grills, workout equipment, and playground equipment. Unfortunately, rising costs post-COVID-19 pandemic left key elements unfinished. This proposal requests funding to advance the next phase of the original and revised project plan. The project will include constructing shade structures and renovating showers/restrooms at the pool, finishing hardscape/landscape around the pool, renovating renovating concession stands and replacing fencing around ball fields.

## 2025 State Lake Improvement Fund (SLIF) Grant Application(s)

Sponsor: Buckskin Fire District Project: Public Launch Ramp and Facilities Repairs Grant Request: \$128,500.00 Match: \$0.00

Previous SLIF funding was requested for the refurbishment of the current dock structure, signage attached to the boathouse facing the river (visual aid for navigation), and resurfacing the parking lot area. The total allotment was intended to cover the repair of the single bay launch ramp at the facility, however, due to inflationary issues, vendor availability and the Colorado River never being coordinated to be lowered, the funding would not adequately allow for repairs to the ramp. A decision was made to cut and remove the damaged portion of the ramp and leave it out of service so it was not a danger to the public. Need to complete launch repair to maintain conformance with the standards for a facility serving public use and SLIF management. Buckskin Fire District is also requesting funding for new carpet to the facility as the current carpet is approximately 18 years old and a tripping hazard to the public, as well as a new roof for the facility. Personnel have made multiple repair attempts on the roof and bought years of serviceable life, however, staff have reached the limit of their repair capabilities.

Sponsor: La Paz County Sheriff's Office Project: River Patrol Upgrades Grant Request: \$164,339.00



This project will enhance the River Patrol and Search & Rescue capabilities of the La Paz County Sheriff's Office Boating Safety Unit (River Patrol, Dive Team and Search & Rescue). Requested funding will provide needed equipment to enhance boating safety capabilities, public awareness and education on and in the Colorado River. Needed equipment include new 700/800 MHz Public Safety radios, Trauma/First Aid kits

(including oxygen), submersible remotely operated vehicle (underwater drone), and Forward Looking Infra-Red (FLIR) systems. The trained Sheriff's Deputies assigned to the Boating Safety Unit will use this equipment to improve boating safety and education operations among recreational boaters on the Colorado River with enhanced trauma care/first aid equipment, provide better Search & Rescue operations with the underwater drone, provide increased operations during hours of darkness with the FLIR units, and have increased interoperable communications capabilities with other public safety agencies (US Border Patrol, San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office [California], Mohave County Sheriff's Office and local Fire Districts). The Boating Safety Unit currently lacks these equipment items and Sheriff's Office funding is not available.
