Background:

The Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program (ORLP) is a nationally competitive program targeting grant assistance to help economically disadvantaged urban areas with no, or almost no access to publicly available, close by, outdoor recreation. Projects are submitted through the states to the Director of the National Park Service who selects projects based on the federal scoring criteria. These grants require a minimum 1 to 1 match, must have a population of at least 30,000 and a poverty rate within the affected community of 20%. A project may apply for up to \$15,000,000 per project.

Subject: Law Enforcement Motorized Grant Scoring Criteria

Background:

In 2017 the Grants and Trails Team developed 4 Supplemental Motorized Grant opportunities to help distribute funds. Since then, there has been an influx of Law Enforcement Supplemental Grant requests. As a result, the agency is seeking approval for the proposed Law Enforcement Motorized Grant Scoring Criteria from the State Parks Board. At their January meeting, the Off-Highway Vehicle Advisory recommended the Law Enforcement Motorized Grant Scoring Criteria as presented by staff. In February, the Arizona Outdoor Recreation Coordinating Commission recommended that staff amend the proposed Motorized Law Enforcement scoring criteria to include additional points for local law enforcement agencies. The table provided below highlights the requested edits proposed by staff.





- Must be within a community that is determined to be disadvantaged per Climate and Environmental Justice tool
- Provide new or significantly improved opportunities in urban, disadvantaged communities lacking walkable outdoor recreation (within ½ mile)
- Can apply for up to \$15,000,000 per project

2024 Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program Process

- States select projects to forward to NPS for review
- Reviewed and scored at the national level
- If selected, projects then are invited to submit a full application
- Full application is reviewed at the national level for final awards
- Applications due April 30,2024
- Anticipated award date: November 1, 2025





2024 Heritage Fund Local, Regional, and State Park (LRSP) Grant Application(s)

Sponsor: City of Winslow

Project: 9-11 Remembrance Garden and Park Improvement

Grant Request: \$145,770.00 Match: \$145,787.00 Total: \$291,557.00






Winslow is requesting funding to install lighting, a gazebo, and a sign at the 9-11 Remembrance Garden and Park. Yuma County was awarded a Land and Water Conservation grant for the development of a new park, Foothills Park. The project includes new parking, walkways, picnic areas with ramadas, green open space, a playground, new restroom and related infrastructure. Project is 80% complete and the request is for additional funding to cover the increased cost of a new restroom and related infrastructure to complete Phase I of the new park.

Pinal County is requesting funds to develop a new regional park, Palo Verde Regional Park, located in the western part of Pinal County southwest of Maricopa within the Palo Verde Mountains. The park plan includes a dynamic range of recreational opportunities for picnickers, non motorized trail users, night sky users and tent/RV campers. Palo Regional Park is approximately 497 acres owned by the Bureau of Land Management. BLM issued the lease for the property to Pinal County in September 2022. The proposal is part of a master plan which was developed in 2016.

Funding will be used to upgrade an existing restroom and toilet in the east wing of the Frank Lloyd Wright Museum. The current restroom is not accessible. Work will include new masonry, new walls, replacing tiles, bathroom fixtures, and framing. All will be built to today's ADA standards. Constructed in the 60's, the improvements will bring this into compliance for accessibility as the museum continues to upgrade the entire facility.

The park renovations will give residents access to a state-of-the-art playground with ADA features, a tournament-certified skate park and pump track, walking paths with inviting landscapes and lighting, and a premier destination-based splashpad. By enhancing Rotary Park, the City seeks to create a vibrant and inclusive outdoor space that caters to residents of all ages and abilities, fostering community well-being and engagement.
