2023 Recreational Trails Program Non-Motorized Grant Applications

Sponsor: Wild Arizona

Project Title: Heal the Highline, Phase II

Grant Request: \$149,977.00—Match \$11,416.00 Total: \$161,393.00





This project proposal adds to work currently underway from Pine Trailhead to Washington Park. This proposal extends the trail work from Washington Park to the Tonto Fish Hatchery, and specifically will:

- · Address deferred maintenance needs on approximately 2.12 miles of trail
- Decommission and rehabilitate 6.4 miles trail

Following construction of rerouted trails, the former trail prism will be reclaimed to reduce lasting impacts to the watersheds that the Highline trail crosses. The former trail sections will be blocked to foot traffic. Compacted tread will be broken up and/or scarified by hand approximately 4 inches deep to allow native grasses, plants and seed to take hold and grow. In sections where appropriate, native seeds will be used to help to augment revegetation. In order to prevent further erosion on the trail bed the natural contour of the slope will be reestablished.

Sponsor: Verde Valley Trail Fund

Project Title: Copper Chief Trail Season 3

Grant Request: \$150,000.00—Match \$17,543—Total \$167,543.00





Due to its limited access points, rugged country and years of unmanaged recreation occurring along the planned trail corridor, Phase 3 is planned to take at least three field seasons to

complete. This Recreational Trails Program grant, augmented with other fundraising, will perform the following during the 3rd field season (2023-2024):

- Completion of the Copper Chief Trail, a 10-mile trail
- Installation of gate guards, if required
- Rehabilitation and restoration of land in areas where illegal motorized and nonmotorized routes are used along the construction corridor

Work during this 3rd field season will be performed by a combination of FS personnel, professional trail builders, youth conservation corps members and volunteers.

Sponsor: Verde Valley Trail Fund

Project Title: Copper Chief Trail Season 2

Grant Request: \$50,000.00—Match \$89,143.00—Total \$139,143.00





This project is another phase of the Blowout Wash Trail System located within the Verde Valley Ranger District of the Prescott National Forest near Clarkdale and Cottonwood. The Heritage grant will complete 3-5 miles of the Copper Chief Trail, installation of cattle guards and rehabilitate and restore land in areas where illegal motorized and non-motorized routes have been established.
