The Lake Havasu Bureau of Land Management Office (LHFO) manages 1.3 million acres of public lands which have wide swaths of adjacent state managed land. Most of this land is only accessible by high clearance, off road vehicles with 4x4 capabilities. Trails on both federal and adjacent state public lands are often unmaintained and worn out due to high use and weather events. Lake Havasu is well known for its off-roading events such as races and poker runs which takes place on state and federal lands. The off-roading community is continually growing within this area. The LHFO proposes the purchase of three side by sides and two trailers to better access and provide outreach to the off-roading community as well as assisting our state agency partners with sharing their educational message on public lands. Side by side purchases will include two sport models and one utility model.

The LHFO intends to utilize these side by sides to better manage public land by:

- Help promote and spread educational awareness to the OHV community on both federal and state public lands.
- Remove trash and debris from OHV recreation areas on state and federal lands (Standard Wash, Bison Wash, Shea Road, Craggy Wash, AZPT) and provide a presence at public cleanup events.
- Access and identify OHV trails in need of maintenance
- Access and provide educational outreach at Special Recreation Permit (SRP) races and other public events (Sand and Water Expo, UTV Word Championships, Parker 400).
- To provide safety and educational courses (ROHVA) to BLM and partner agency personnel on side by side usage.
- To foster public relations with the local off-road communities.





This project addresses the long-standing issues of scattered trash, illegal dumping of household & construction debris, & graffiti painted on rocks & boulders in OHV areas. Since 2020, Arizona has seen a massive increase in the number of people recreating in OHV areas, including new users, & users who are not practicing responsible recreation. As a result, there has been an increase in the amount of trash and graffiti left behind in OHV areas. We fill a need to keep existing trails free from trash & graffiti to ensure they remain open to the OHV community; if these issues aren't addressed, land management agencies will seek to close them. It takes a continuous effort to keep trails open & accessible to current & future generations.

Restorations enhance the quality of the experience OHV trails provide because clean trails are safer, attractive, & inviting. These cleanups improve the look of impacted OHV areas and the events allow an opportunity for education and connection with the recreating public.

During this project, the Dedicated Restoration Team will complete 21 trash and graffiti removal restoration projects & we will host 2 volunteer events in OHV areas. Volunteer events will provide close to home opportunities for youth, the OHV community, non-OHV community members, & State Parks employees. The hope is to add additional volunteer events as match over time as it becomes easier to host events on public lands without restrictions.

Bullhead City – OHV Trailhead Development

The City of Bullhead City will utilize the funds to develop an OHV Staging Area at the intersection of Silver Creek Rd and Bullhead Parkway. The site will be utilized for parking and off-loading OHV's for use on existing adjacent trail systems. The funds will also be utilized for engineering costs, grading and any other infrastructural improvements.

The proposed project will be the first OHV Staging Area in the City of Bullhead City. It will provide multiple pull through parking spaces for RV/trailers, tow vehicles and OHV's to park while utilizing existing adjacent trails. Accessible restrooms, night security lighting, and camp host area are planned. An information kiosk will be provided on the restroom building for up-to-date trail information and related. Additionally, the development will see a day-use picnic area with shade structure tables, benches, electrical outlet, and spigot amongst other amenities. The Site layout and concept plan is attached for reference.

The proposed Bullhead City OHV Staging Area is designed to accommodate the following type of motorized vehicles: Dirt Bikes, Off-Road Trucks, Quads (ATV's), Side-by-sides (UTV's), and Jeeps and similar 4-WD vehicles. This project will enable the City the opportunity to continuously provide off-road recreational opportunities to the its residents and tourists alike in a safe and dedicated environment.

The Alpine and Springerville ranger districts have multiple snowmobile recreation areas that provide ample opportunity for winter recreators, but for many years we have observed intrusions with snowmobiles into wilderness areas and other closure areas on these districts. The Wilderness Act of 1964 prohibits the use of motor vehicles and motorized equipment within any wilderness area. Our purpose is to provide education to the public on OHV regulations and wilderness laws and if necessary, administer citations. The grant funding would aid in overtime and personnel costs for patrolling of these high use areas, closure areas and wilderness boundaries and give the Forest Service an opportunity to educate winter recreators. The funding would also enable the purchase of an enclosed trailer for transporting snowmobiles and to allow for safe short- and long-term storage of the snowmobiles.




Funds will pay for Law Enforcement support for Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) areas on the Globe Ranger District. The scope of work will include patrolling forest roads to educate users on responsible use of national forest lands and enforce federal and state rules and regulations. Patrollers will inspect for proper display of the required OHV sticker and spark arrestors. They will also take measures to deter the public from riding illegal user created routes which includes contacting users, signage, physical barriers. These patrols will increase public awareness of rules and regulations and will be a deterrent for illegal behavior. Patrollers will work with Forest Service, Game and Fish, County and other law enforcement agencies to assist with these educational opportunities.
