A. CALL TO ORDER

Member Chuck Wood called the meeting to order at 1:00pm

B. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chuck Wood led the Group in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance

C. MEMBER ROLL CALL

Juan Colorado-Alvarez conducted member roll call

D. AGENDA ITEMS

1. Consideration of Action to Approve Minutes of the March 28, 2023, OHVAG Meeting.

Chuck Wood moved to approve minutes of the March 28, 2023 OHVAG Meeting. Holly Irwin seconded the motion. Consensus. The motion passed.

2. OHVAG Will Consider and May Take Action on A Recommendation to the Arizona State Parks Board to Approve, Modify, Or Deny Funding for The Submitted 2023 Competitive Motorized Grant Application(s). (Presenter: Matthew Eberhart, State Off-Highway Vehicle Coordinator)

Pat Headington moved that OHVAG recommend that the Arizona State Parks Board approve funding for the Competitive Motorized Grant Application(s) as follows; Arizona Alpine Trail, Inc, Arizona Alpine Trail Master Plan Project in the amount of \$316,503.00. Holly Irwin seconded the motion. Geoff Chain approved. Jason Cobb approved. Todd Davis absent. Pat Headington approved. Holly Irwin approved. Tom Murphy approved. Chuck Wood abstained. Verdict: the motion passed.

Member Headington: Wondering if there are utility trails involved in this plan? Is the State Land Department involved? Member Cobb asked if the trail is now open/promoted? Member Chain asked, does the Plan engage with the community's existing trails? Matt answered that the Plan is engaging with the community in the form of outreach and engagement alongside the OHV Ambassadors. Member Wood answered that driving on forest roads has been established in the Plan. The Forest Service prefers to develop on forest roads. Council Jerry in agreement with Member Wood to proceed with the Trails Plan as the organizations with the trails along with the public are in favor of the plan. Member Headington asked if the Plan uses specific OHV (such as dirt bike, ATV, Side by Side, UTV, etc.)? Council Jerry responds the Plan is specific to avoid busy/constricted roads; thus' Forest Service recommends to use natural areas to move away from busy areas and engage with nature. Meaning this is not specific to the type of OHV utilized in the Plan. Matt adds this is to utilize the access roads and to

get more details for the Plan. Member Cobb asked about a membership owed to the AZ Alpine Trail? Council Jerry responds that the membership will include to follow the rules & laws of the road along with equipment requirements (Helmet, Gloves, Eye Protection, Ankle-High Boots, etc). Matt asks the cost of the membership? Council Jerry responded with a minimal charge (possibly a discount) in the amount of \$25.00USD. Member Headington addresses there are no sanitized facilities in the Plan. Logan Simpson to note this suggestion into the Plan.

- Identify, plan and execute on-the-ground maintenance and restoration conservation projects
- Seek out private funding partners
- Build relationships with local enthusiast groups and powersports dealerships
- Coordinate with federal and state public land management agencies on education, conservation and communication efforts

Award Amount: \$49,950

Arizona State Parks and Trails is seeking funds to provide facilitation services to the Greater Sedona Recreation Collaborative. 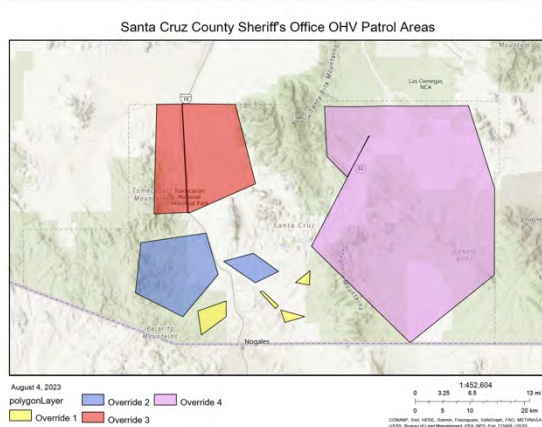

The Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office will utilize the funds to purchase two (2) side by sides equipped with emergency light package, roll cage, roof, doors, brush guards and other necessary equipment. The project will be matched with the purchase of two (2) tandem axle trailers. These OHV's will be utilized for the purpose of educating the public on Arizona Off-Highway Vehicle Laws and safety as well as enforcement of Arizona off-highway regulations.

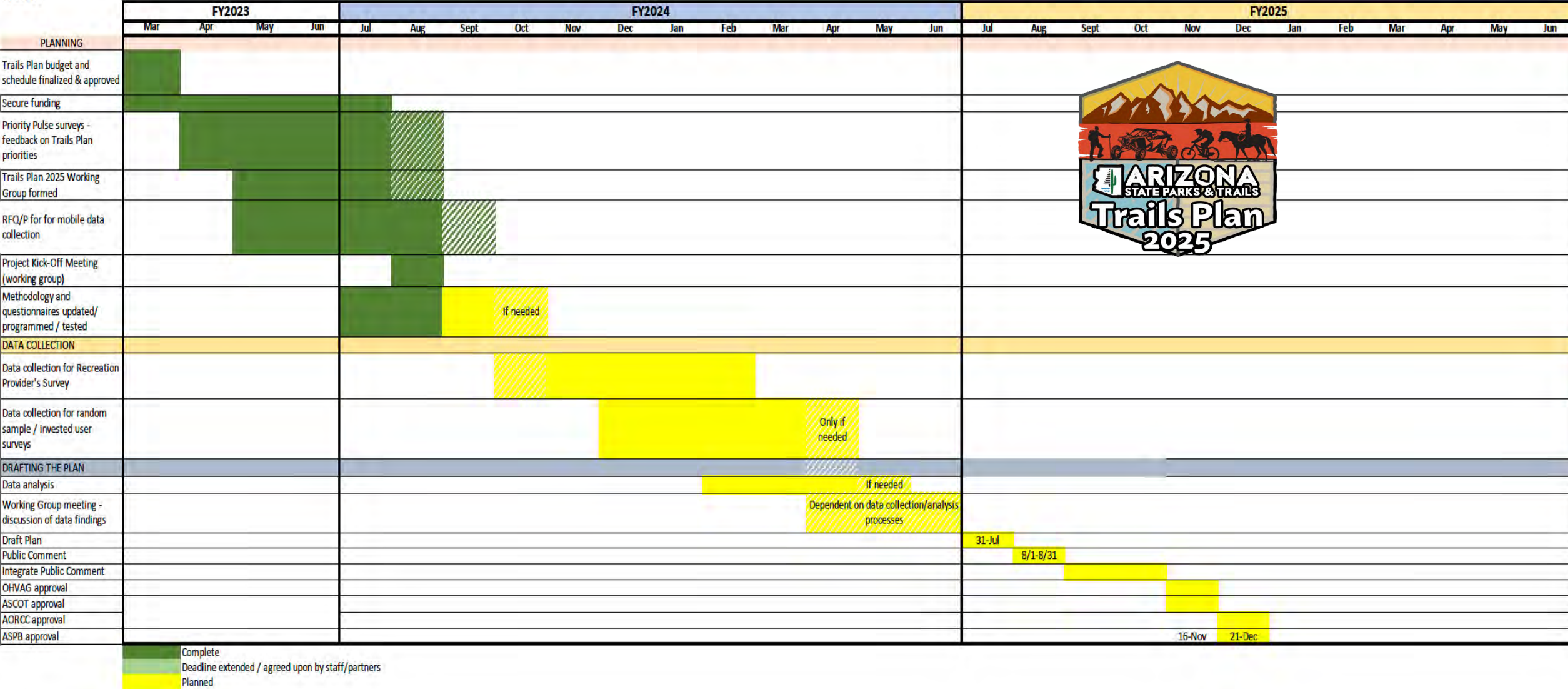
