The First Regular Session of the 57th Legislature adjourned sine die on June 27th, 2025 at 1:20 pm. This memo includes the “Summary of Legislation” which was written and compiled by the Chief Legislative Liaison and identifies bills that have an impact to ASPT. The report includes bill descriptions with hyperlinks which will connect the user to the Chaptered Bills and also to Bill Status Inquiry (BSI). BSI provides the complete history of the bill, including all versions, amendments, the summaries and legislative action in both the Arizona House and Senate.

GENERAL LEGISLATION:

HB 2013: public safety cancer insurance:

Summary: Changes the Public Safety Cancer Insurance Policy Program (Program) account to use up to 10% of the total claims paid averaged over the past five years instead of up to 10% of account monies to pay administrative costs.

HCM 2012: antiquities act; exception:

Summary: Cites the misuse of the Antiquities Act of 1906 and requests an exemption from certain provisions the act.

HCR 2021: food; municipal tax; exemption:

Summary: Prohibits a city, town or other taxing jurisdiction from imposing a municipal transaction privilege tax on sale of food items intended for home consumption, unless the city, town or other taxing jurisdiction is compliant with outlined requirements for imposing a transaction privilege, sales, use, franchise or other similar tax or fee.

SB 1517: off-highway vehicles; weight:

Summary: Allows the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to issue a temporary general use registration, that allows an off-highway vehicle (OHV) to be operated for not more than 30 days, to a person who is a nonresident who owns an OHV titled in another state and otherwise meets OHV requirements. Extends the OHV study committee (study committee) by two years.

SB 1735: 2025-2026 general appropriations act:

Summary: Appropriates monies for the operation of the state government in FY 2026.

SB 1737: capital outlay; 2025-2026; appropriations:

Summary: Makes capital appropriations and reductions to state agencies in FY 2026.
