PROGRAM INFORMATION

FREE ADMISSION: Registered students, teachers, and chaperones get in **free!**

TIMES: Field trips are available from 9:00am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday. Field trips typically include three, 45-minute learning sessions.

GROUP SIZE: We are able to accommodate more than one class per field trip, but the total students for each visit is limited to **50**.

SUPERVISION: A minimum of **one adult per 10 students** is required for a day visit. All visiting adult chaperones are expected to participate in the supervision of the students.

Important Preparations

We strongly recommend that all participants carry water bottles, use sunscreen, and wear hats and suitable hiking shoes.

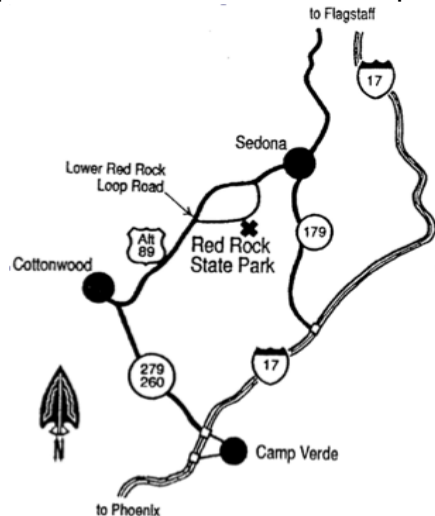
If you are participating in the water lessons, please have students bring a change of shoes that they can wear in the creek. A plastic grocery bag is helpful for wet shoes when they are finished.

If school visits also include a scheduled snack and/or lunch break, students must bring a sack lunch and pack out their own trash. Food should not be carried by students while attending classes.

Special Accommodations for students, such as wheelchair accessibility, must be requested in advance.

Directions

Turn from 89A onto Lower Red Rock Loop Road; drive three miles to park gate.



Red Rock State Park was opened to the public in the fall of 1991 as an environmental education center. Oak Creek meanders through the 286-acre park, surrounded by the scenic red rocks of the Sedona area. Diverse wildlife and plants abound in the riparian habitat, making Red Rock State Park an ideal location in which to learn about the natural environment of the area.



Our environmental education goal is to connect the knowledge that students gain in the traditional classroom with engaging outdoor learning experience. This allows students to make new discoveries and develop an understanding of the interconnectedness in the natural environment. The Connection Program promotes the development of a lifelong stewardship ethic through this achieved awareness and appreciation!

The Connection Program is a standards-based curriculum. Activities are based on resources such as Project WILD, Aquatic WILD, Project Learning Tree, Arizona WET, GEMS, and many others.

Park Rules & Regulations

Please be considerate and follow the park rules and regulations. Explain the rules to all children and adults accompanying the group on your visit.

Red Rock State Park is a **“Pack In – Pack Out”** facility. Trash bags must be provided by your group and removed at the end of the visit. Do not leave any trash at Red Rock State Park.

Do not deface, destroy, or remove public property, or archaeological, geological, or historical objects found within the park. Respect the habitats of all plants and wildlife.

Stay on designated trails.

No pets are allowed in the park, except certified service animals.
