**Sierra Vista - Shared Use Path Kayetan Drive
Amount Awarded: \$100,000.00**



In an effort to both aid in the connectivity from said parking lot to Cyr Park and an ADA compliant shared use path design has been produced and is shovel ready. ARPA Funding for this shared use path the construction of this path would provide a physical area to safely recreate for pedestrians and cyclists. This Path will also serve to improve both the physical and mental health of residents in these Qualified Census Tract Areas through their newly acquired ability to access additional outdoor activities and experience less confinement due to the many restrictions imposed through the COVID pandemic.

**Coconino County—Ft. Tuthill Sewage, Restroom and Parking Lot upgrades
ARPA Awarded: \$923,306.00**

This project will provide greater outdoor recreation opportunities to park visitors by improving two parking lot surfaces at Fort Tuthill County Park, a regional park in Coconino County, and by installing a sewer line under one of the parking lots for future campground improvements.

Fort Tuthill County Park is seeing increased winter use with the addition of a snow play business and increased marketing by the City of Flagstaff on their winter recreation map. The parking lot project would be evaluated by engineers, re-graded to improve drainage, with two layers of chip seal added which will provide an improved, safer surface for all seasons. The project would also install a new sewer line (approx. 1,400 linear feet): Previous campground attendance is over 15,000 visitors/year, and the campground is currently served by a septic and leach field. Without this funding, the parking lots would continue to deteriorate and require continuous maintenance and staff time, plus cost of fill material.

Eloy—Jones Park Improvements

ARPA Awarded: \$679,000.00

This project includes the renovation of the playground area, specifically the installation of new playground equipment to replace the current dilapidated equipment; and the installation of an outdoor Fitness Court which will serve as a bodyweight circuit training center for adults of all ages and abilities. The skate park, built in 2004, is currently in dilapidated condition. Requesting funds to install new skate park equipment. Additionally, they are requesting funding for new LED lighting equipment for the ball field. A new LED lighting system would reduce light pollution and can be operated remotely, increasing park staffers' efficiency. Finally, Eloy is requesting funding to repair the damaged pool deck at the City's public pool. The goal is to provide the community youth a safe and well-maintained community space to serve their recreational and social interaction needs. If awarded, the City of Eloy pledges to maintain the equipment, conducting regular inspections and performing any service/repairs as necessary.

Camp Verde—Butler Park Lighting

ARPA Awarded: \$493,272.00

This project funding would replace old and inefficient sports field lighting nearing the end of its lifespan at two Town sports fields (1 soccer/football & 1 baseball/softball) and one tennis court located at 1213 Gardner Lane with new more efficient LED lights. Existing pole mounted Sports Field and Tennis Court light assemblies and associated wiring will be replaced with new LED lighting from the original manufacturer using existing light poles and control equipment. A new 25 year warranty will cover all onsite materials and labor including existing portions.

City of Tucson – CSM Martin Gunny Barreras Park
