Meet Rocky!

Rocky the Ringtail Cat is the mascot for Arizona State Parks & Trails and the State Animal of Arizona.

The ringtail (*Bassariscus astutus*) is a mammal of the raccoon family, native to arid regions of North America. Even though it is not a cat, it is also known as the ringtail cat.

Ringtails have a pointed muzzle with long whiskers resembles that of a fox (its Latin name means 'clever little fox') and its body resembles that of a cat.



These animals are characterized by a long black and white "ringed" tail with 14-16 stripes, which is the about the same length as its body. The claws are short, straight, and semi-retractable, well-suited for climbing.

Smaller than a house cat, its body alone measures 12-17 in. and its tail averages 12-17 in. from its base. They

Ringtails are primarily nocturnal, with large eyes and upright ears that make it easier for them to navigate and forage in the dark. An adept climber, it uses its long tail for balance. The rings on its tail can also act as a distraction for predators. The white rings act as a target, so when the tail rather than the body is caught, the ringtail has a greater chance of escaping.

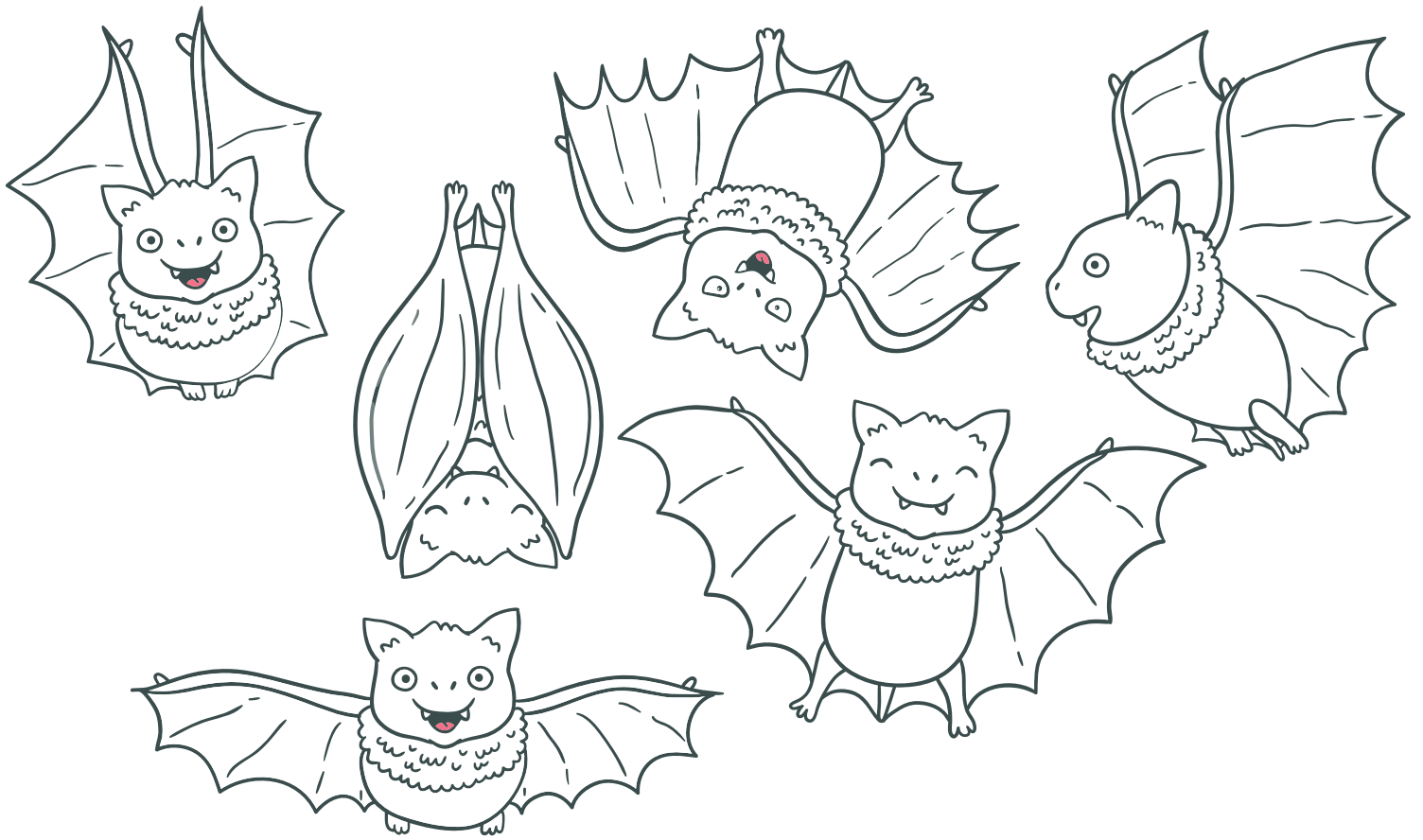

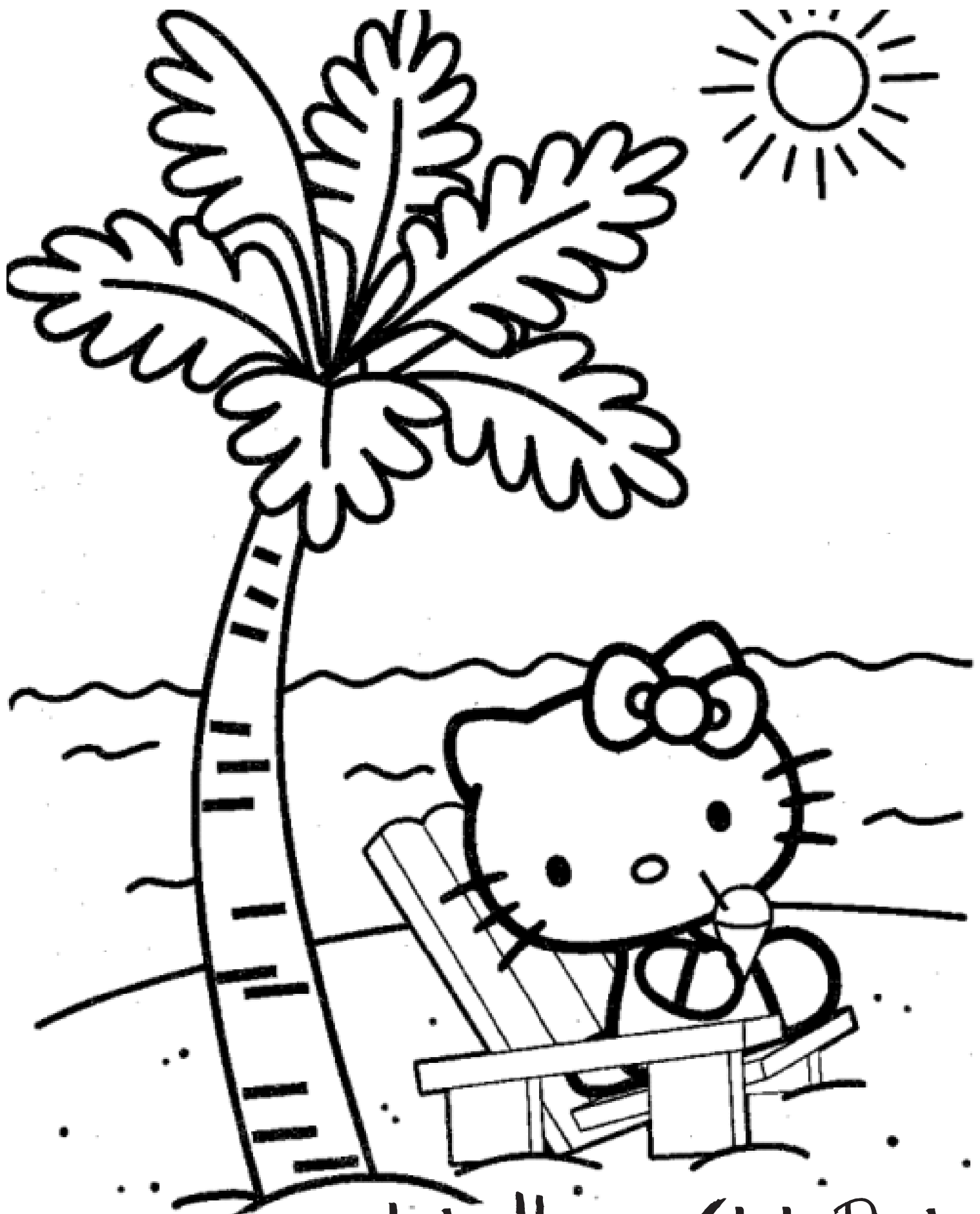


Kartchner Caverns State Park

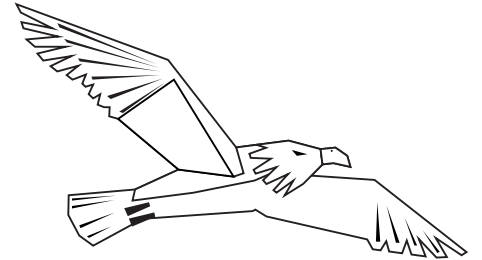
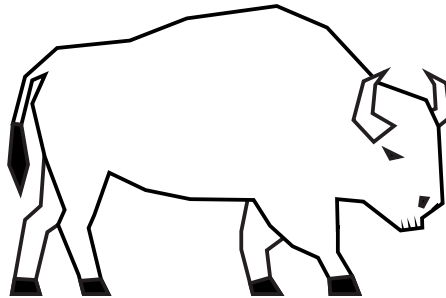
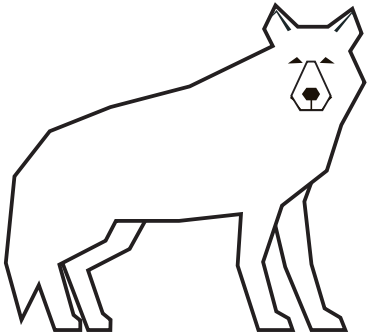
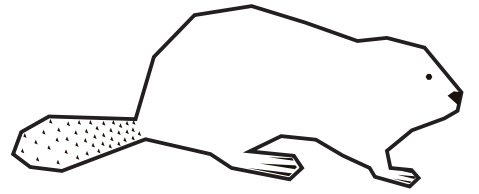
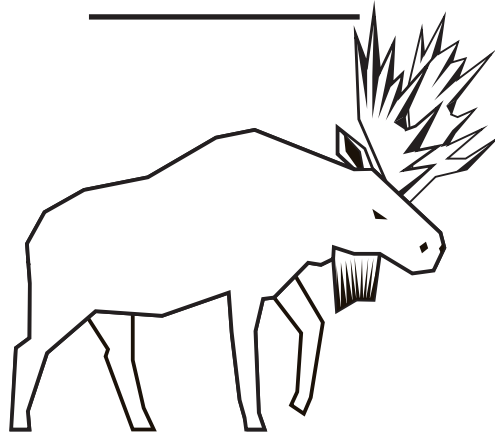
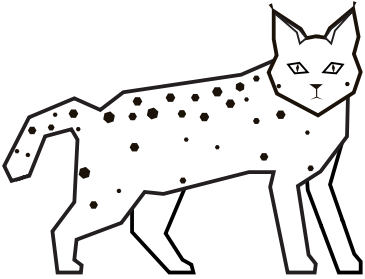
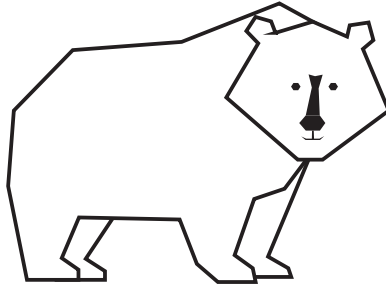
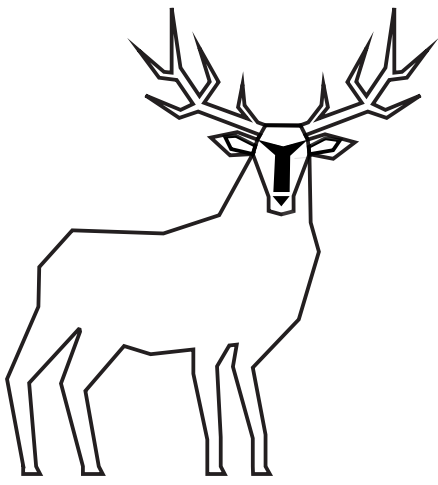








Animal Scramble

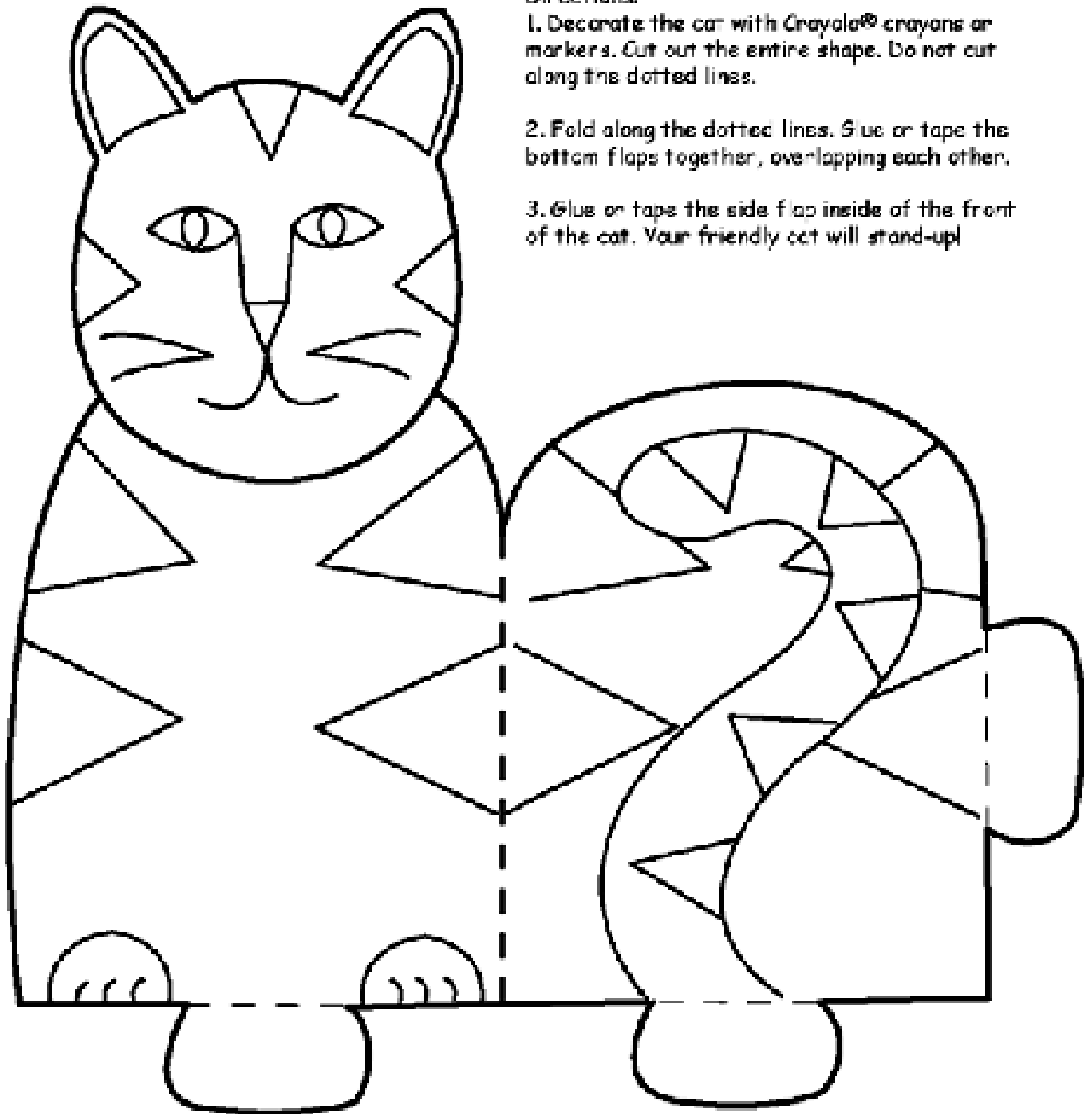

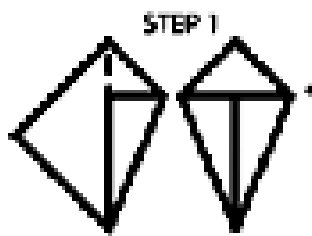
Friendly Cat

Directions:

1. Decorate the cat with Crayola® crayons or markers. Cut out the entire shape. Do not cut along the dotted lines.
2. Fold along the dotted lines. Glue or tape the bottom flaps together, overlapping each other.
3. Glue or tape the side flap inside of the front of the cat. Your friendly cat will stand-up!



Folded-Paper Swan



STEP 1

1. Fold the sides in to the center line as shown. This is called a "kite fold". Then flip the paper over to the back.



STEP 2

2. Fold the sides in again.



STEP 3

3. Now fold up the bottom point as shown to form the neck. To make the head, fold the point partially down as shown in A above. Then fold the entire shape in half, as shown in B.



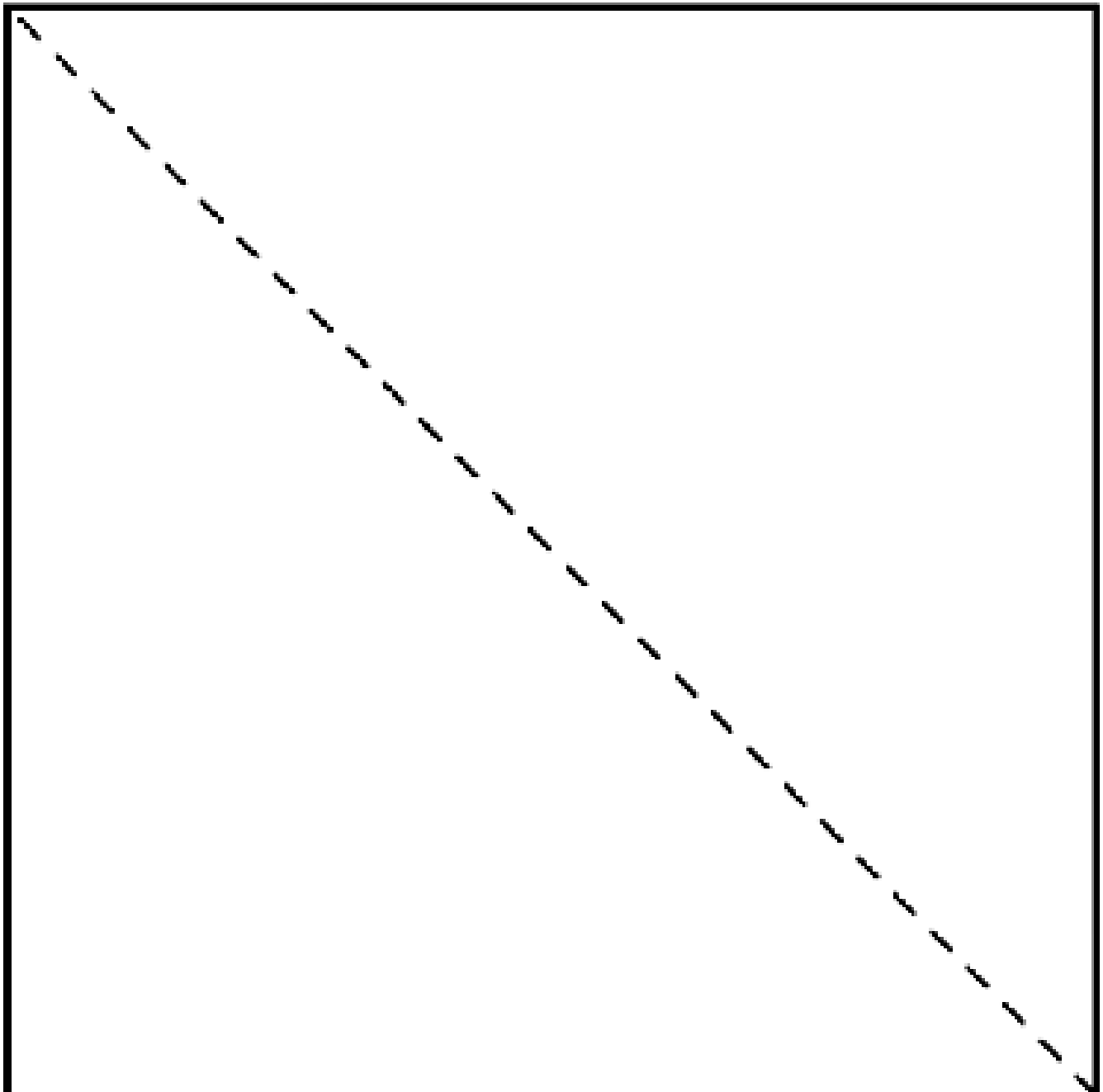
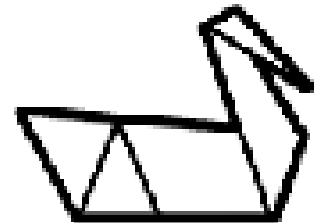

Put the neck and head out and pinch the bases so they stay. Spread out the swan's body and it will stand up!



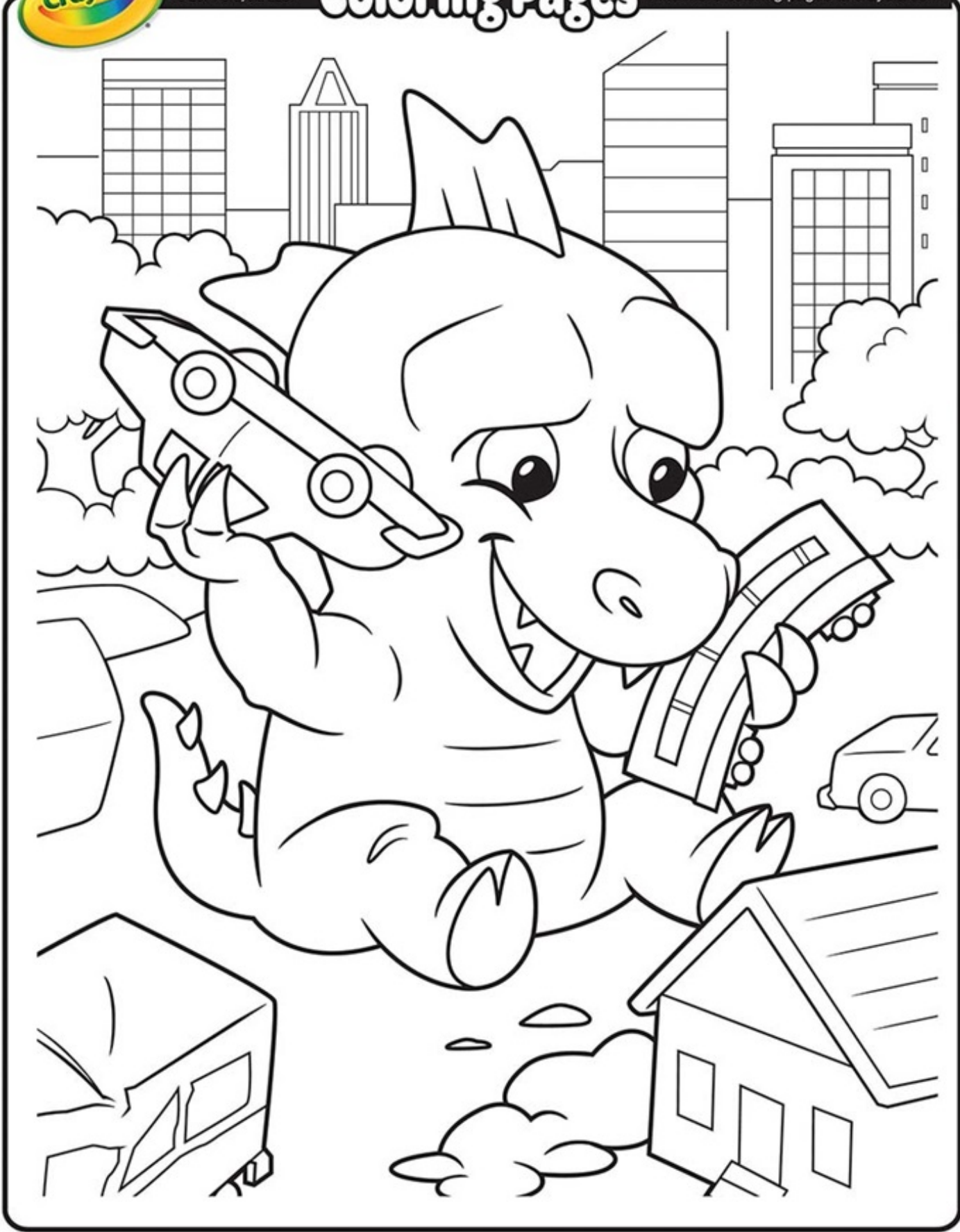
You can decorate the swan's front and back with colorful cut halves you fold over around



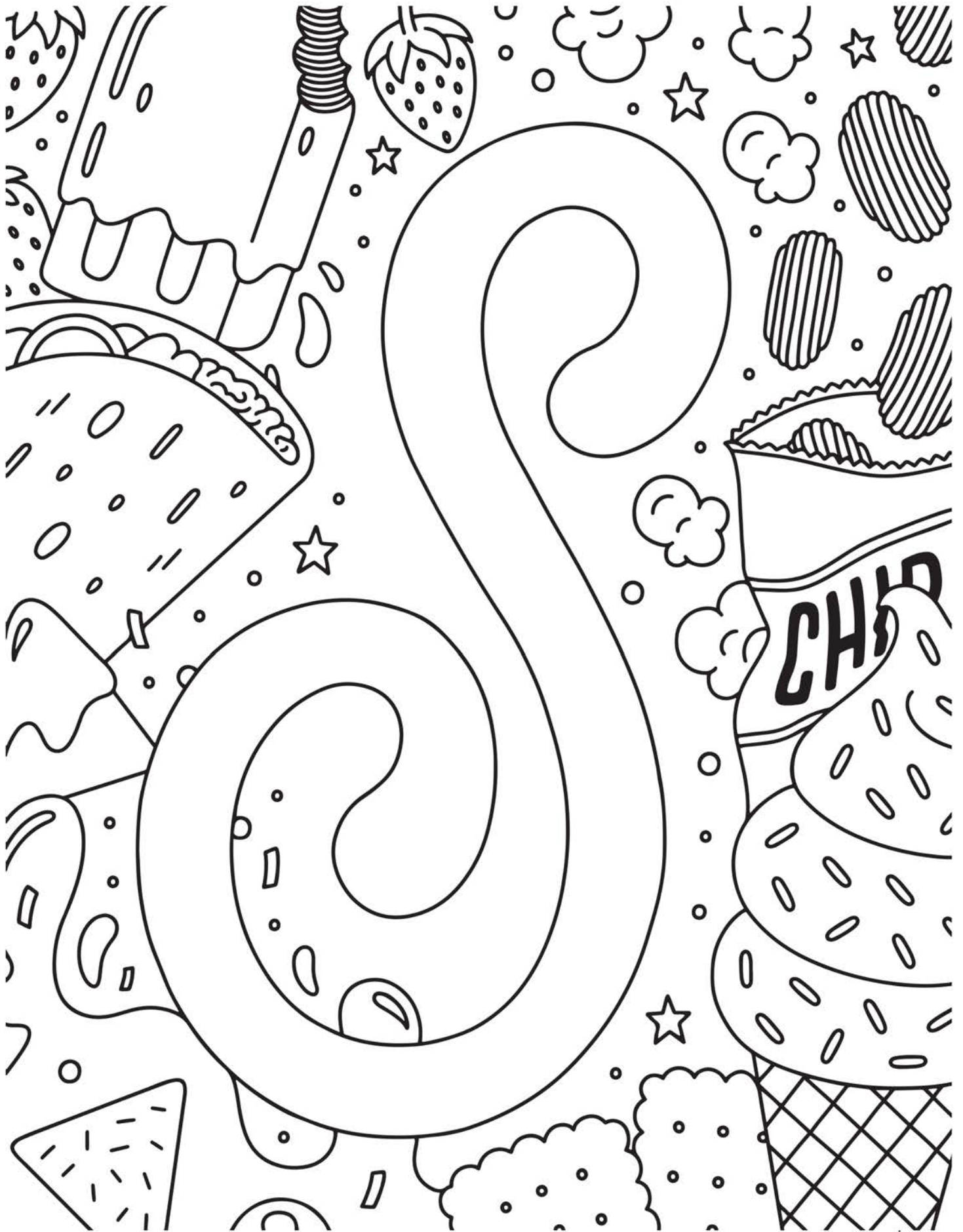
