Biotic Communities

The park is located at elevations between 2,650 and 3,000 feet with a wide range of vegetation characteristic of the Sonoran Desert. The Sutherland and Canada del Oro Washes flow through the park creating several miles of riparian habitat. Look for the greatest variety of birds in these areas.

Hummingbird feeders are located around the visitor contact station. A variety of hummingbirds can usually be found there throughout the day.


Riparian areas (waterways) within the park such as Sutherland Wash and the Canada del Oro Wash support and attract a diverse bird population.


