



Continue through Cottonwood on Main Street (the street will gradually curve to the left). Turn right (North) on North 10th Street. You'll see a brown information sign for the park before the 10th Street turn.

Biotic Communities

The park is located in the Verde Valley along the banks of the Verde River in the community of Cottonwood. The elevation is 3300'. The vegetation spans from the riparian zone along the river banks to the upper Sonoran desert.

Although many of the birds are permanent residents, some are only seen as they migrate through the Verde Valley.
