



NOMINATION CRITERIA


- Must be existing trails
- Must be publicly owned/managed and available for public use
- Only non-motorized trails
- Trail must be a minimum of one-mile in length, unless it demonstrates unique characteristics
- Must be open for public use the majority of the season

HOW TO APPLY

- Application Forms on Trails Program page
- Rolling application, ASCOT reviews annually in January
- Nominations will be reviewed by a committee, representing trail managers and trail users.
- Successful trails will be included in the system for 5years, and can re-apply after the 5-year period to remain in the system.


