# **ASCOT Duties and Responsibility**

- Meetings frequency is based on need and work product
  - Generally 4-5 times a year/typically no more than 2 hours
- Serves as an advisory committee to the Arizona State Parks Board on development, planning, maintenance, funding and promotion of nonmotorized trails in Arizona
- To assist staff with development and coordination of trail workshops and conferences
- To maintain a statewide trail system plan to include:
  - Identify significant trail routes and complementary facilities
  - Assess physical condition of these systems
  - Assess usage of these trails
  - Develop procedures for selecting these trails



# **ASCOT Duties and Responsibility**

- Adhere to Arizona's Open Meeting Law
- Follow Roberts Rule of Order
  - Everyone has the right to speak if they wish
  - Follow the agenda
  - All action items require a motion and a second
    - Followed by discussion and a vote
  - All motions can be amended
  - Votes are taken by roll call(exception is the roll call which can be approved by voice)
  - ASCOT meetings must be open to the public and a quorum of members must be present for this meeting
  - All agendas must be posted a minimum of 24 hours prior to meeting
  - Minutes must be taken and draft posted 72 hours after adjournment



# **ASCOT Duties and Responsibility (Continued)**

- Avoid gatherings of more than 50% of members—this is considered a public meeting
- Exceptions social events—but should be posted that a quorum may be present but that no business of the public body will be discussed
- Do not send e-mails to all members
- Communication between the members should go through park staff only
  - This should not be forwarded to other members by committee members
- E-mails of members related to their official duties are public records
- Teleconference during the pandemic is the accepted public meeting
- Meetings must be accessible and at reasonable times
- Agendas must contain enough information reasonably necessary to inform the public
- All discussions must be reasonably related to an adequately described agenda item



## **ASCOT** Duties and Responsibility (Continued)

- New items must be added to a future meeting
- Public must identify themselves when talking
- Must be recognized by the chair
- Public cannot disrupt the meeting
- Public can present not be involved with asking specific questions and a back and forth with the committee—can direct staff to schedule matter for a future meeting
- Things to avoid
  - Passing notes or texting back and forth between members
  - Whispering to other members
  - Allowing the public talk with individual members before the meeting



## **ASCOT Duties and Responsibility (Continued)**

- Conflict of Interest
  - At times members shall abstain from action items if the action will result in a decision that may benefit a member
- Members serve at the pleasure of the Arizona State Parks Board
  - Shall comply with the State's Standard of Conduct
  - Cannot use resource for political activities
  - Use position for personal gains
  - Perform an act in a private capacity that may be construed to be an official act
  - Accept anything of economic value as a gift, gratuity, favor
