**1. Consideration of Action to Approve Minutes of the February 13th, 2020 Board Meeting –**

**2. Review and possible action to approve funding for the submitted 2020 Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant Applications.**

*Mickey Rogers, Arizona Chief of Grants and Trails provided information on three Land and Water Conservation fund applications totaling \$1,284,006.00. This included two new projects, the City of Show Low's Frontier Park Inclusive Playground and Splashpad Project and City of Yuma's Riverfront Regional Park Development Project. There was also an approved project, Town of Springerville, ADA Path/Playground/splash pad project that changed its scope and took out the splash pad which was a major feature of the original project. John Sefton moved to approve the town of Springerville's ADA Trail/Playground project in the amount of \$184,006, the City of Show Low's Frontier Inclusive Playground and Splashpad project in the amount of \$600,000 and the City of Yuma's Riverfront Regional Park Development Project in the amount of \$500,000.00. Terri Palmberg seconded. Dale Larsen approved, John Sefton approved, Lisa Atkins approved, Debbie Johnson approved, Shawn Orme approved, and Terri Palmberg approved. The motion passed.*

**3. Arizona State Parks and Trails Update:**

*Bob Broscheid, Executive Director of Arizona State Parks gave an update to the Board on the effect of COVID-19 at state parks. Parks has taken several steps to meet the requirements of social distancing at all of the parks. Most parks are still open with measures to keep the parks open while keeping the safety of employees as the number one priority. Lisa Atkins, Commissioner of the State Land Department, gave an update on the effect on State Lands and Debbie Johnson, Executive Director of the Arizona Department of Tourism and the affect the “stay at home” requirement is having on tourism and Arizona’s economy.*

The 2015 Arizona State Parks and Trails Plan has maintaining existing trails as its number one priority. For the past several years, Arizona State Parks and Trails has set-aside up to \$150,000 in recreational trails funding for maintenance of existing non-motorized trails.

A potential sponsor can:

- Apply for up to \$50,000 per project and if approved
- Select from three contracted crews pre-approved by state parks to perform this work
- Provide the 5.7% non-federal match
- Once the project is complete and work approved by the sponsor, Arizona State Parks and Trails pays the contractor directly
- Work must be completed within one year of receiving funds
