Background:

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding provides funding to assist facilities that were impacted during COVID. Statistically, the use of outdoor recreation nationwide increased over 20% during the peak of COVID. Outdoor facilities including local parks and trails provided safe socially distanced spaces for families and children to go during this pandemic. They also provided essential benefits to mental and physical health which is specifically defined in the Rescue Act guidelines. The focus of these funds at these facilities is for sewer/water upgrades, broadband and at facilities within neighborhoods in areas that have been identified as underserved communities. These funds are available loosely in the same categories as the appropriated Heritage Funds. A total of \$5,000,000 was made available for this program. These grants require no match and must be completed within two years of the funds being awarded.
