






Homol'ovi: Place of the Little Hills







Park History

- November 1980 Governor establishes
 Archaeology Advisory Group
- November 1982 article "The Anasazi" in National Geographic
- 1984 Homolovi Research Program and Homolovi Management Board established
- May 21, 1986 Governor Bruce Babbitt signed bill allowing acquisition and establishment of park
- 1986-1993 Land acquisition, construction and archaeological study
- May 22, 1993 park dedicated and opened to the public
- February 22, 2010 park closure
- March 2011 Park re-opened with Hopi partnership and name change






Settlement Periods at Homolovi

• Late 1260-1400 CE




Early Period 620-890 CE





Middle Period 1000-1225 CE






Late Period 1260-1400




Homolovi State Park Revenue by FY






Homolovi Revenue Fiscal Year to Date December 2021






Homolovi Visitation by FY






Homolovi Vistation FY to Date December 2021






