USeDirect **

System Feature Highlights

- Automated Self Check-in and Check-out for Camping & Cabins using personal mobile devices (internet connected)
- Waitlist/ Standby List for customers to receive automated notification of Cabin & Campsite openings
- Apple Pay/ Google Pay Touchless payment system at sales points using mobile phones or chipped cards
- Retail Inventory & Management Manage, issue, report and financially control Inventory; Tracking of transfers between locations; Manage by store location
- Advanced campsite maps with enhanced details, Latitude/ Longitude, trails and points of interest
- Notification Dynamics Renewal reminders for pass holders, registrations, customer information based on preferences, reservations and other activities

Features for Future Test Pilots

- Fast Pass Entry Allows passholder to enter through a special lane with a scanable or electronically readable pass. (Requires ASPT to purchase hardware, messaging system access and likely to require site construction)
- Advance Day Use Sales Advance sales or reservations to guarantee park entrance for day use (additional fees for proprietary messaging system)
- Self-Pay Kiosks To allow fee payment and park entry with or without mechanical gate (Requires ASPT to purchase hardware and will require site construction)

<u>Mobil Application</u> – **Not Selected**. Will require future amendment or 3rd party development to obtain additional services. No vendor proposals included features sought by Parks. Parks will continue to use the current Mobile Application.


IPS Revenue Process

Current Process

- ASPT charges a non refundable reservation surcharge for all reservation transactions
- ASPT currently collects all revenues including reservation surcharge and deposits them into the ASPT bank account. All revenues are transferred to the SPRF (State Park Revenue Fund)
- Payment for the reservation system is made out of the SPRF Operating Appropriation

New Process


- Vendor will collect <u>reservation surcharge fees</u> through vendors' merchant account (MID)
- ASPT will collect <u>camping/cabin base revenue</u> through ASPT merchant account (MID)
- Operating funds previously committed to paying for the reservation system will now be available for park operations



^{*}A.R.S. 41-511.21, sec D - State Park Revenue Fund, "The board may collect monies as a surcharge on park reservations and shall determine the surcharge rate as provided in section 41-511.05, paragraph 8 after considering the costs to plan and administer the reservation system."
