

Background:

Arizona State Statute § 41-511.04 allows the state parks board to annually collect and expend monies to plan and administer the land and water conservation fund program, in conjunction with other administrative tasks and recreation plans, as a surcharge to subgrantees in a proportionate amount, not to exceed ten percent of the cost of each project. This 10% surcharge, which Arizona State Parks has collected for the past several years, must be paid by the project sponsor prior to grant funding being awarded. With the passage of the Great American Outdoors Act, the LWCF program will receive a significant increase in funding, which will increase the total surcharge payment to an amount exceeding what is necessary to administer the program. Currently, these administrative fees are used to fund staff working on the program, interns that assist with the program, national conference travel and training, costs related to conducting approximately 150-250 required yearly site inspections, as well as a number of additional administrative tasks. While the Off-Highway Vehicle Program and the Recreational Trails Program both have a percentage of funding set aside for their administration, there is no administrative funding for the LWCF program.

With LWCF apportionment fluctuating annually, the surcharge percentage should be based on yearly apportionment and projected program administration costs. A reduced surcharge will decrease costs to potential grantees and allow them to use any savings for the required 50% match.

Recommendation:

Staff recommend that the Arizona State Parks Board allow Arizona State Parks staff to determine annually the surcharge percentage based on projected costs to administer the program and the annual LWCF apportionment.




