

Observer: Date: Time: Weather: Noteworthy observations (Please report new sightings to the park staff) **Birding Tips** • The bird feeding stations in the Hummingbird Garden are a great place to sit quietly for a close-up view of birds coming into the feeders.

- The visitor center roof is another good viewing point for birds around the feeders and the broader area.
- There is typically a higher density of resident (all-year) and breeding birds (spring/summer) along the riparian habitat along Oak Creek. Try the Kisva Trail if you want to see the most diversity of species along a trail.
- Low voices and slow movements will enable you to watch birds going about their everyday business; loud noises and sudden motions will disturb them and prevent you from enjoying their presence.

Red Rock State Park is located 5 miles west of Sedona off State Hwy 89A on the lower Red Rock Loop Road.





Biotic Communities

The park is located at an elevation between 3,800 - 4,200 feet with most of the vegetation of the Upper Sonoran life zone characterized by Pinyon-Juniper woodland. Oak Creek, which is spring-fed, flows from Oak Creek Canyon through the park for a mile and a half, creating a riparian habitat along its length. Look for the greatest variety and abundance of birds in this area.
